





The index is reported in a four-week rolling average; this week's results are based on a random national sample of 1,000 adults, reached by landline and cellular telephone, in the four weeks ending May 3, 2015. Results of the individual CCI gauges have a 3.5-point error margin. Field work and tabulation by SSRS/Social Science Research Solutions of Media, Pa.

As of May 1, 2014, the index is derived by averaging the positive responses to each index question. Results can range from 0 (all negative responses for all three measures) to 100 (all positive responses for all three measures). See details here. The survey began in December 1985.
